(PART 1)</p> <p>"This is a brief introduction on how to design large national health care benefit packages using fair and rational decision making methods. A digital tool for priority setting in health, FairChoices - DCP Analytic Tool, will be used. FairChoices presents information on the cost and health benefits (lives saved, disabilities averted or disability adjusted life years averted) of more than 200 health care interventions (e.g. routine childhood immunizations, TB treatment, orthopedic surgery, antihypertensives) for multiple low- and lower middle-income countries (e.g. Nigeria, Zanzibar, Malawi, Ethiopia). Cost-effectiveness and other measures will be used to set priorities. Budget impact analysis will also be conducted so that budgets are realistic and resource constraints are being made explicit, which avoids benefit packages in health that are unrealistic. A mix between mini lectures and exercises will be used.
